The Grand Master to Retire

Having served 4 years as a Provincial Grand Master, 5 years as an Assistant Grand Master and 3 years as the Deputy Grand Master, I was elected as the Grand Master during May 2020, during the Covid lockdown period. As there was no certainty regarding my installation date, MW Bro David Duncan OSM, the current Grand Master whose term of office ended during that year, retired in June 2020 and I became the Acting Grand Master. To ensure that our members remained active and positive, we became acquainted with zoom or similar technologies and I increased the usual 4 physical Grand Committee meetings per year to virtual meetings every 6 weeks. We also introduced virtual appointments of Presiding Masters where necessary and encouraged our Lodges to hold their monthly meetings on virtual platforms.

I was eventually installed as the Grand Master on 5 December 2020. At the time we were still required to wear masks and maintain social distancing and were unable to invite members of foreign Grand Lodges to attend my installation as we were restricted to 50 members in the De Goede Hoop temple. As a result of this, we decided to amend the installation ceremony to exclude all signs of recognition and to film it. We duly edited the film and invited all the Grand Lodges with whom were in amity to view it a week later. At the end of the ceremony, I was able to interact virtually with several Grand Masters and other senior Brethren who represented their Grand Lodges. This very interesting film was a great success and has now received more than 6,000 views on Youtube.

As a result of the support and encouragement which I received from the Grand Lodge Officers and members, I have enjoyed a busy term of office. I have appointed and installed 2 Provincial Grand Masters, RW Bro Johan van der Merwe (Eastern Division) and RW Bro Simon Nash (Northern Division). I have attended the Annual Meetings of all the Provincial Grand Lodges and I attended to the consecration of Lodge Jeffrey's Bay and the reopening of Vereeniging. I have dedicated 2 new Masonic Temples, in Port Elizabeth and in Jeffrey's Bay and I have attended to the rededication of several Lodges, including de Goede Hoop (250 years), De Morgenster (150 years), Star of the East (100 years), Neerlandia (100 years) and Parys (100 years). As I was unable to perform the rededication of Lodge Brits (50 years), RW Bro Brandon Topham attended to this event on my behalf.

I have had the honour of presenting the Order of Service to Masonry (OSM) to RW Bro Keith Hutton, a 60 year long service jewel to Wor Bro Hylke Jorritsma (Sonheuwel) and 50 year service jewels to RW Bro Piet Naude MSA (Trichardt) and Wor Bros Leon Sher (Star of the East), Martin Prinsloo (Star of the West), Jock Wood (Marina) and Neil McKechnie (Hiram).

I represented our Grand Lodge at the 17th World Conference of Regular Grand Lodges in November 2021 in Germany. As Africa is scheduled to host the 20th World Conference during May 2026, the Grand Committee decided that we should submit an application to do so and I will therefore attend the 18th World Conference in Israel in May 2023. As we were unable to visit Grand Lodges in Africa for more than 2 years, I represented our Grand Lodge at the annual communication of the National Grand Lodge of France during December 2022 where I was able to spend some quality time with several Grand Masters and other senior Brethren from the African Grand Lodges. As I was unable to attend the 155th anniversary of the Grand Lodge of Liberia in March 2023, RW Bro Topham represented our Grand Lodge at this event.

The highlight of my term of office was the celebration of 250 years of Freemasonry in South Africa during June 2022. We produced a Heritage Book which recorded the development of Freemasonry in this country during this period and was compiled by RW Bro Brian Rossouw OSM. The celebrations in Cape Town were attended by numerous Brethren from all the Constitutions in South Africa and their partners.

My term of office ends this year, and I have decided not to make myself available for a second term. As a result, the next Grand Master will be elected by the Grand Conclave during May 2023 and I will attend to his installation at the Annual General Meeting of our Grand Lodge during July.

Westerford Host Scottish Grand Master

As most of you will already be aware, the Most Worshipful Grand Master Mason of the Grand Lodge of Scotland, Bro Ramsay McGhee, was recently in South Africa to install the new District Grand Masters of all the local Scottish Districts.

As he was to be in Cape Town for a few days before his Western Cape Installation, he expressed an interest in attending a GLSA working. As luck would have it, Westerford were performing a 1st degree working and our Grand Master, MW Bro John Smith

OSM MSA, would be available to receive our very distinguished visitor. The Master of Westerford was the Southern Division PGM, RW Bro Tom Hardiman, a Grand Ritualist in his own right, and he and his



Lodge had a reputation MW Bro Smith and Bro McGhee for performing extremely high quality ritual work.

This historical evening promised to be a most memorable one and it was. The candidate, Guy Taylor, was from de Goede Trouw and he had an evening that he should remember throughout his Masonic journey.
