Enhancing our Masonic Journey

As archaeologists steadily discover more of old Jerusalem, so do the Masonic degrees under the Orders of the Royal Arch, the Cryptic Rite and the Knights of Captivity become more relevant. The Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa is a separate but integral part of our Grand Lodge and it is therefore important for you, our members, to know how you can enhance your Masonic journey after obtaining your third or Master Mason's degree in your Craft Lodge. There is a logical progression of Masonic degrees from the Apprentice degree, dated at the start of the construction of King Solomon's temple in Jerusalem in about 974 BCE, through its destruction by the Babylonians to the construction of the second temple in Jerusalem about 400 years later.

Three of these degrees are grouped under the Royal Arch Order, four under the Cryptic Rite and three under the Knights of Captivity. All these degrees fall under our Supreme Grand Chapter. The degree of Mark Master Mason, being the first degree in our Royal Arch Order, complements the Fellowcraft degree and is based on a date between 974 and 967 BCE, being the accepted period during which King Solomon's temple was constructed. It teaches us about Marks and their importance in construction of the temple. As records were lost and memories faded, some of the further Masonic degrees were originally based on legends. One legend held that while the first temple was being built, King Solomon ordered the construction of a secret vault where its treasures could be hidden in the event of an enemy

attack. The craftsmen who laboured on this project were carefully selected and were sworn to secrecy. After the death of Hiram Abif and later King Solomon, the knowledge of this secret vault was eventually lost.

The next logical degree is the first degree in the Cryptic Rite, being that of Select Master. This is based on a date about 969 BCE and deals with the construction of the secret vault beneath the temple. The next logical degree is the second degree in the Cryptic Rite, being that of Royal Master and deals with the death of Hiram Abif and the consequences thereof. The next logical degree is the third degree in the Cryptic Rite, being that of Most Excellent Master and this deals with the completion of King Solomon's temple and its dedication during or about 967 BCE.

More than three centuries later and during or about 605 BCE the Babylonians attacked Judah and eventually succeeded in defeating it. The next logical degree is the fourth degree in the Cryptic Rite being that of Super Excellent Master. This degree is dated to the final conquering of Judah and the destruction of King Solomon's temple by the Babylonians during about 586 BCE. This war and its consequences are related in several books in the Volume of the Sacred Law and referred to in Psalms 19 and 137. The lyrics of the well known song, *Rivers of Babylon*, are based on these Psalms.

The next logical degree is the second degree in the Royal Arch Order being that of Excellent Master and this deals with the return of the Judeans (Jews) from Babylon to Jerusalem to commence with the rebuilding of the temple under the leadership of Zerubbabel. This degree is complemented by the first degree in the Knights of Captivity series, being that of Knight of the Sword. The next logical degree is the third degree of the Royal Arch Order, being that of Royal Arch Mason and deals with the discovery of the secret vault under the ruins of King Solomon's temple and the consequences thereof. The building of the second temple presented its own challenges and the next two degrees in the Knights of Captivity series, being that of Knight of the East and that of Knight of the East and West explain these challenges and the results thereof.

Like a true love story, our Masonic journey will never end. There is however much to look forward to as a member of the Grand Lodge of South Africa in enhancing our Masonic journey.
